Nayak Farms Recognized at White House Conference on Hunger, Nutrition & Health

On September 28th in Washington D.C., <u>Nayak Farms</u> of Gardner, Illinois was recognized at the White House Conference on Hunger, Nutrition and Health (WHCHNH) for their dedication and pledge to tackling food insecurity in Illinois and the Midwest. The invite-only WHCHNH is the first conference in over 50 years since President Nixon's White House Conference on Food, Nutrition and Health to unify Americans around the goal of ending hunger and reducing diet-related disease by 2030.

As the largest private donor of sweet corn to the State of Illinois, Nayak Farms has donated thousands of pounds of sweet corn to the major Illinois food banks to help fight food insecurity through its inaugural harvest with their <u>Sweet Corn Initiative</u>. The Nayak Farms' Sweet Corn Initiative intends to tackle food-insecurity in the State of Illinois by donating large amounts of fresh sweet corn to Illinois Food Banks. At the Conference, Nayak Farms was recognized for their commitment for large crop donations to the State of Illinois and Midwest in the upcoming years and also for our work on supporting local and state policies to support farmers in tackling food insecurity.

"Today, the White House announces a historic package of new actions that business, civic, academic, and philanthropic leaders will take to end hunger and reduce diet-related disease. Pillar 1-Improve Food Access and Affordability. NAYAK FARMS: Nayak Farms, a 200-acre farm in Illinois, will work to combat food-insecurity in Illinois, Indiana, Missouri, and Iowa. This includes donating over 1,000,000 pounds of sweet corn to food-insecure families in those four states by 2026; donating 50,000 pounds of green beans to food-insecure families in 2023 and 2024; and championing local and state policies that can support farmers in combating food insecurity."
